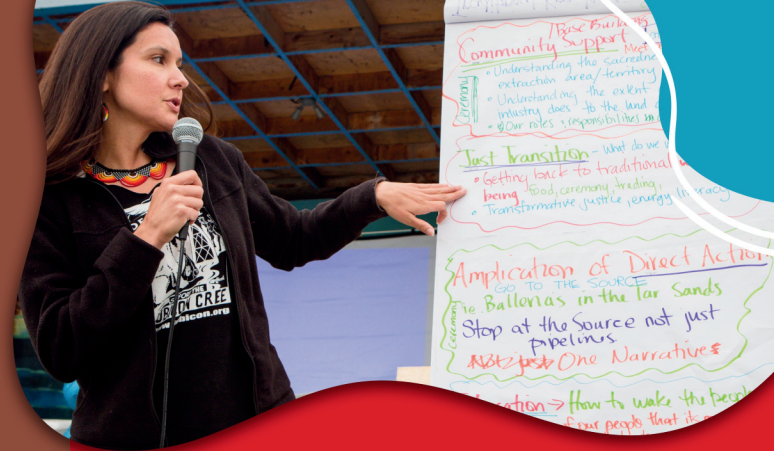
WHAT WE DO

The **Climate Leadership Program (CLP)** is a transformative initiative built through community engagements and knowledge-sharing sessions from across so-called Canada. Fundamentally, the CLP serves to facilitate capacity-building, information and resource exchanges, and advocacy among Indigenous leaders, communities and beyond.

ELIGIBILITY

In order to qualify for this program, participants must:

- Self-identify as Indigenous;
- Have a strong desire to create positive change in your community / organization;
- Be located somewhere on Turtle Island (so-called North America);
- Be 18 years of age or older; and
- Be open to hosting a workshop in your community / organization.



PROGRAM COMPONENTS

1. **Leadership training** → Receive comprehensive leadership training that includes Indigenous ways of knowing + being, climate science, policy advocacy, and community engagement.
2. **Cultural preservation** → The CLP promotes preservation of traditional knowledge & practices as essential components of climate adaptation & mitigation.
3. **Community workshops** → The CLP workshops provide practical tools & knowledge at the community level to foster grassroots-led climate initiatives.
4. **Advocacy & policy support** → Get guidance for engaging with policymakers, and advocating for Indigenous rights & climate justice at local, national, and international levels.
5. **Resource access** → Gain access to a network of resources & technical support to develop climate projects within participant communities.
